Our Westminster Church family has much to be grateful for as well. From programs that seek to serve our community by sharing the love of God in various ways to events that nurture and support our relationship with God and with each other, we have many reasons for gratitude to God. We miss those who have died during this past year and commend them to God who created them, sent them into this world and has received them into God's loving embrace. We miss them and trust that God will continue to shepherd us all until all things are held together in Christ Jesus (Ephesians 1:10).

In the meantime, we have work to do. Our focus this year is "Intergenerational". This is the word our Session shared with us following the Session retreat of July 2024. Put simply, our faith works better when all generations are present. This year, we will be intentional about creating opportunities for all the generations of our church to be together. Opportunities might include praying, serving, and connecting through worship, study, fellowship and mission activities. We will seek the engage the voices of the generations missing from our gatherings.

That said, something else needs to happen first. There have been occasions for discouragement over the past year. Yours might be different than mine but occasions of discouragement can dampen our energy, just like ash and too much space between the logs can essentially kill the flames in a fireplace, leaving behind only embers and smoke. The fire may not be completely out but something of a rekindling is needed to return the flames. Here is how the author of 2nd Timothy puts it."—I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you..... for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline. (2 Timothy 1:6–7).

The Holy Spirit gives every follower of Jesus gifts to use in loving God and loving our neighbors. This is the spiritual journey. Sometimes, circumstances of life lead to these gifts needing to be rekindled. God did not give us the spirit of cowardice or fear. Instead, we have been given the spirit of power (the same power that raised Jesus from the dead), the spirit of Love (love that serves others as God's beloved children) and the spirit of self-discipline (level-headed self-control that knows that God is always in charge and is present and at work). This is what the Spirit has given to us. God wants these gifts to be rekindled in us and to burn brightly. It begins with remembering that nothing can separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Has fear and discouragement dampened your enthusiasm and joy? I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is in you... and let us focus on being intergenerational in 2025.


Last Minutes (for 2024!)




Society



Picoult and Jennifer Boylan.














MARINERS' PROGRESSIVE DINNER 2024

Presbyterian Women News




The SOUP & PIE Supper has been Postponed.
